

**About Geisinger College of Health Sciences**

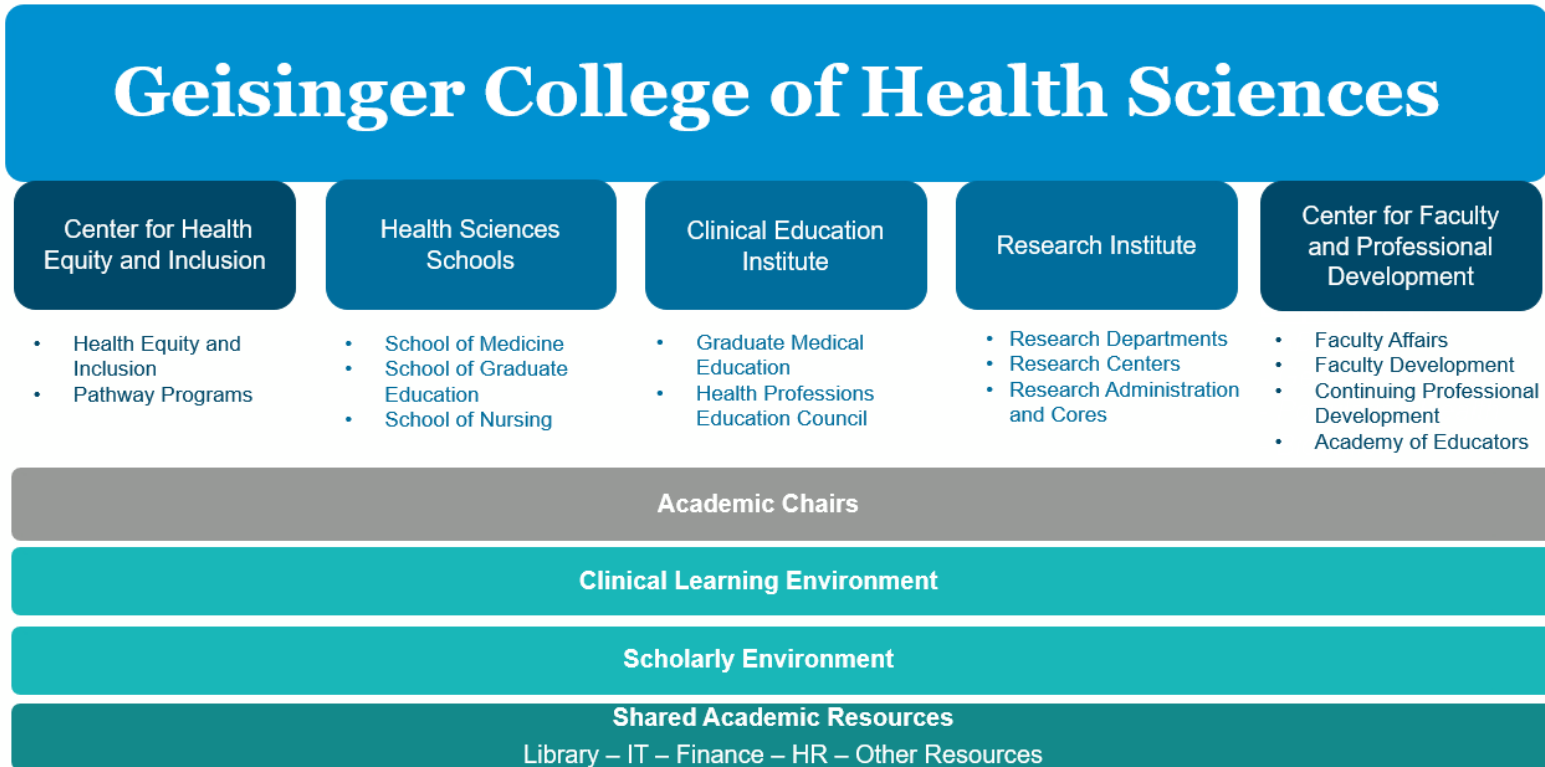
Geisinger College of Health Sciences (GCHS) is comprised of five pillars that epitomize the research and education missions of the Geisinger family.

**GCHS has three core pillars:**

- **Health Sciences Schools**
  - ◇ Geisinger Commonwealth School of Medicine
  - ◇ Geisinger School of Graduate Education
  - ◇ Geisinger School of Nursing
- **Clinical Education Institute**, which provides training for health professionals
- **Research Institute**

**Two additional pillars support the core missions:**

- **Center for Faculty and Professional Development**
- **Center for Health Equity and Inclusion**



### Enrollment 2023 - 2024

The October 2023 enrollment includes 656 students enrolled in three degree programs.

Doctor of Medicine students in Geisinger Commonwealth School of Medicine complete their degree program over three phases in our Total Health Curriculum. Built on the science of learning, the program uses an evidence-based approach to train skilled, compassionate physicians who provide individualized care of patients and promote health in the communities they serve.

Geisinger School of Graduate Education students are either enrolled in the online program or attend classes in-person in Scranton for their Master of Biomedical Sciences (MBS) degree. Students typically complete the degree in one year.

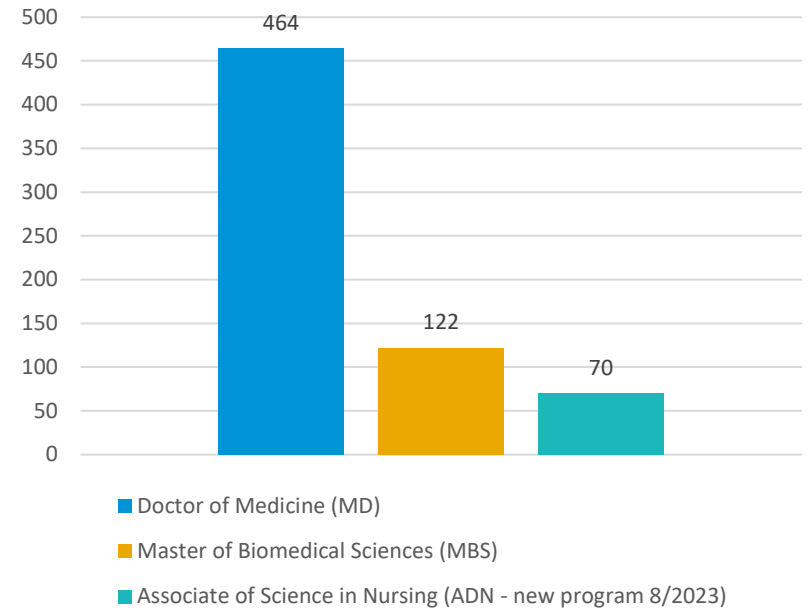
Geisinger School of Nursing enrolled the first cohort of students in the Associate of Science in Nursing program in August 2023. The second group of students entered in January 2024.

### Faculty

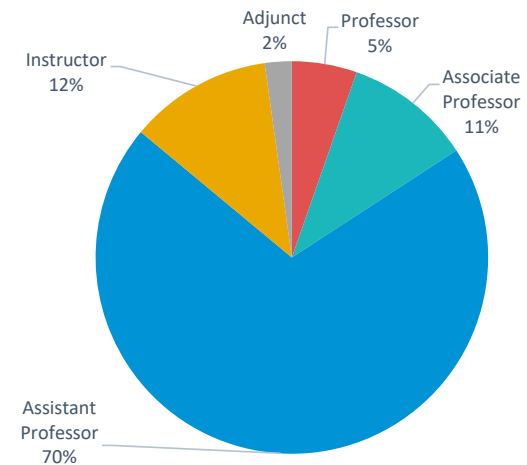
More than 2,100 GCHS faculty members comprise a diverse and highly specialized group of professionals dedicated to educating and training the next generation of healthcare professionals.

### GCHS Faculty by Title



Geisinger Commonwealth School of Medicine (GCSOM) educates students on five clinical campuses providing training in northeastern and central Pennsylvania as well as in New York and southern New Jersey. GCSOM Students interact with patients in three health systems - Geisinger, Guthrie and AtlantiCare.

All MD students complete Phase 1 of the curriculum at our Medical Sciences Building in Scranton.

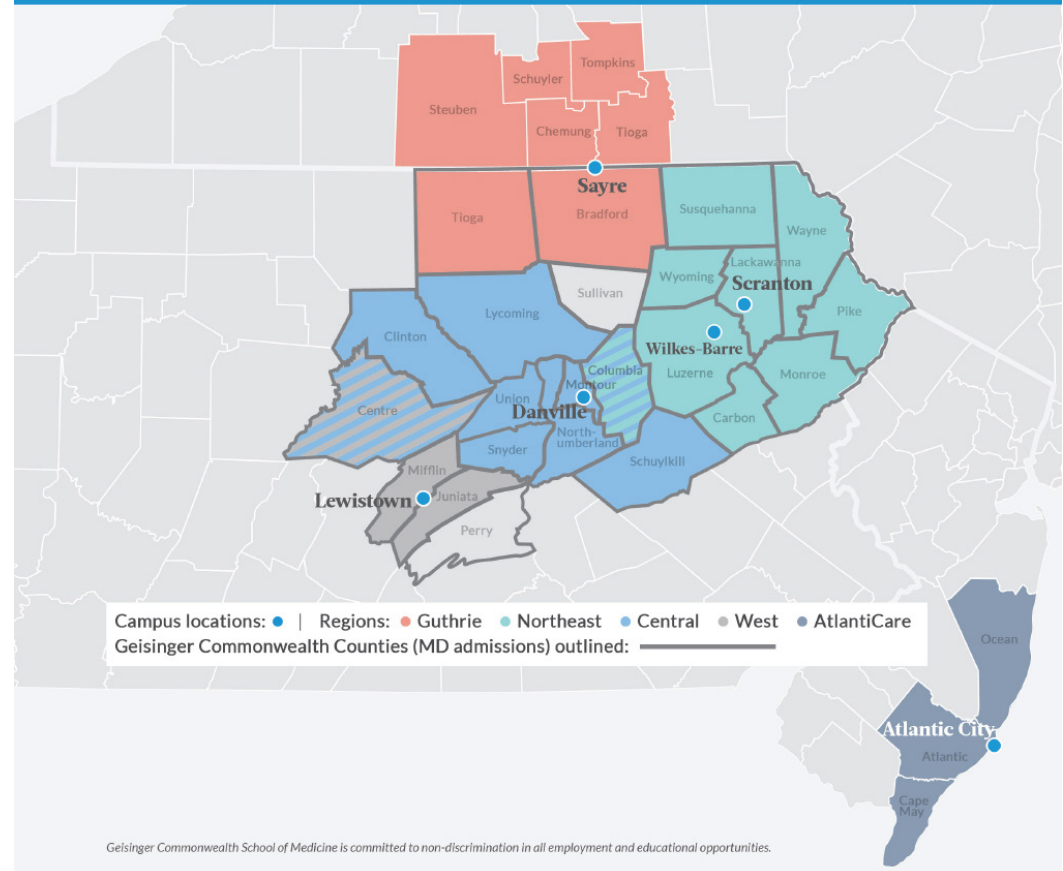
The five clinical campuses where students complete Phases 2 and 3 of the curriculum include:

- Northeast Campus, at Geisinger Community Medical Center in Scranton and Geisinger Wyoming Valley in Wilkes-Barre
- AtlantiCare Campus, in Atlantic City, NJ
- Central Campus, headquartered at Geisinger Medical Center in Danville, PA
- Guthrie Campus, centered at Robert Packer Hospital in Sayre, PA
- West Campus, headquartered at Geisinger Lewistown Hospital with rotations at the Geisinger Healthplex in State College

Each of these campuses is an integral part of the school's distributive model of medical education and provides students with early clinical experiences in diverse settings.

## Regional campuses



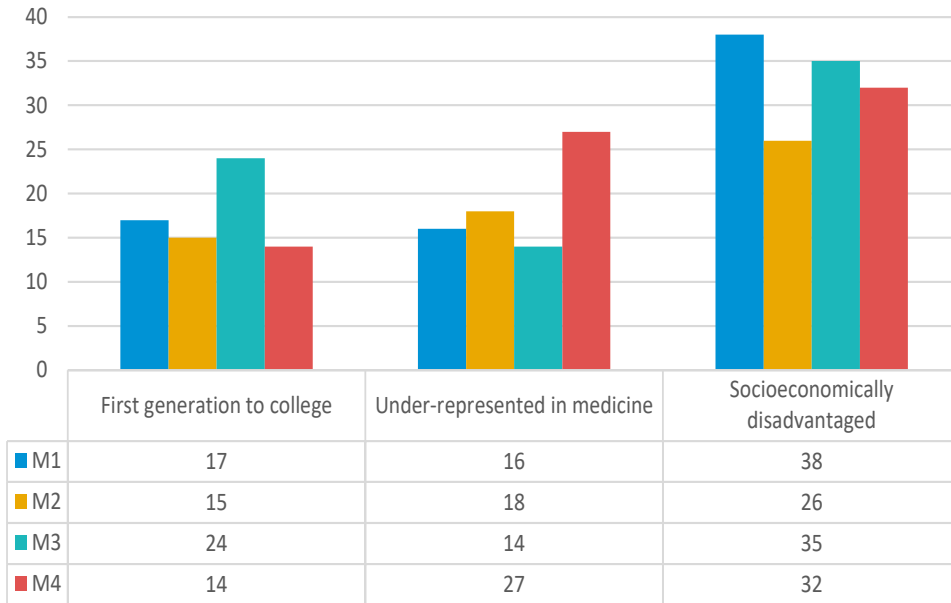
Our regional campuses include:

2023-2024 Class Characteristics



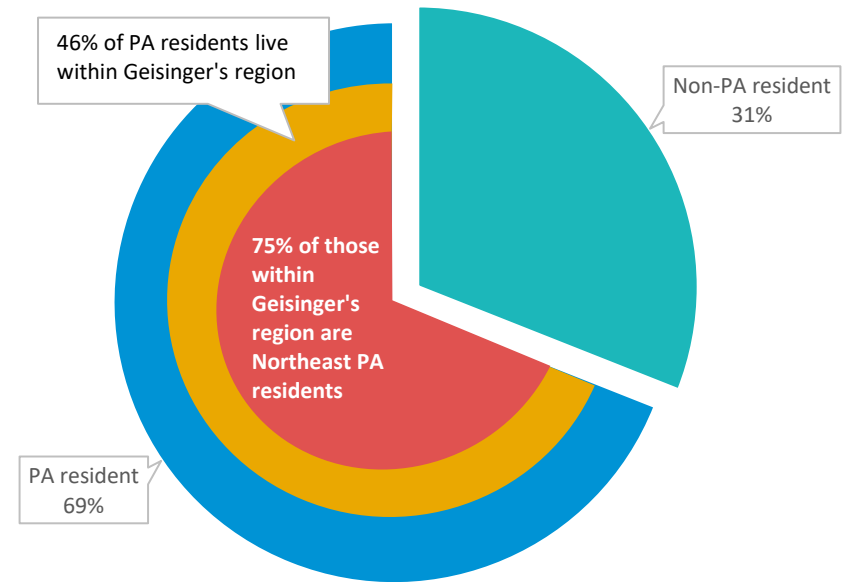

### Abigail Geisinger Scholars Program

Geisinger wants its hardworking medical students to be free to practice medicine the way every future doctor imagines it – through meaningful relationships with people in a community they know and care about. Students accepted to the Abigail Geisinger Scholars program will have their tuition paid by Geisinger and receive a \$2,000 monthly stipend while in school. Students agree to become a Geisinger-employed physician after completing residency training in family medicine, internal medicine, medicine pediatrics, psychiatry or another specified discipline needed by Geisinger.

Abigail Geisinger Scholars in the new 3+3 Program complete medical school in three years, followed by a three year residency in Family Medicine at Geisinger Lewistown Hospital or Kistler Family Medicine Residency at Geisinger South Wilkes-Barre. A 3 + 3 student could also choose an Internal Medicine Residency at Geisinger Wyoming Valley Medical Center in Wilkes-Barre or Geisinger Medical Center in Danville.

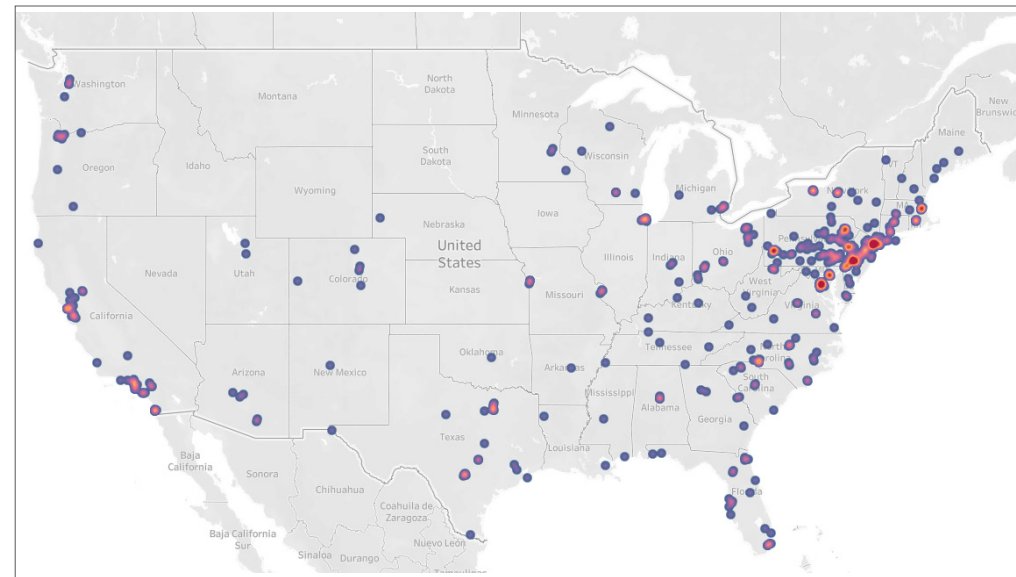
**MD Alumni**

GCSOM was established in 2008 as The Commonwealth Medical College. The school's charter Doctor of Medicine (MD) class of 56 graduated in 2013.

- 11 MD classes have graduated

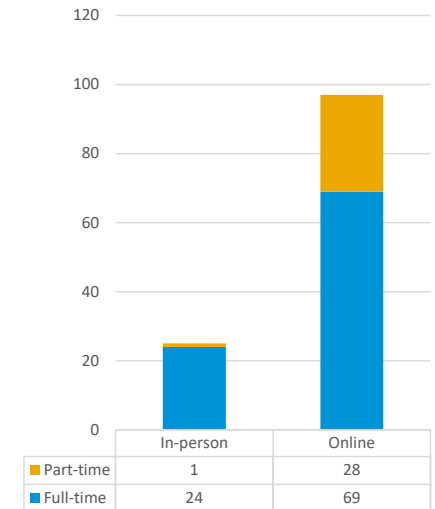
### Master of Biomedical Sciences (MBS)

The MBS program prepares students seeking to position themselves for further graduate study, attend professional school (such as medical, dental or optometry), enter a health-related field or advance their career. The program is designed to be completed in 12 months with entry points in August or January. The program is offered both in-person in Scranton and online through synchronous courses. Although previously offered to part-time students, as of the 2023-2024 year the program will only be offered to new students on a full-time basis.

As of October 2023, a total of 122 students are enrolled:

- 93 full-time
- 29 part-time
- 38 (31%) are first generation to college.

MBS Enrollment 2023 - 2024



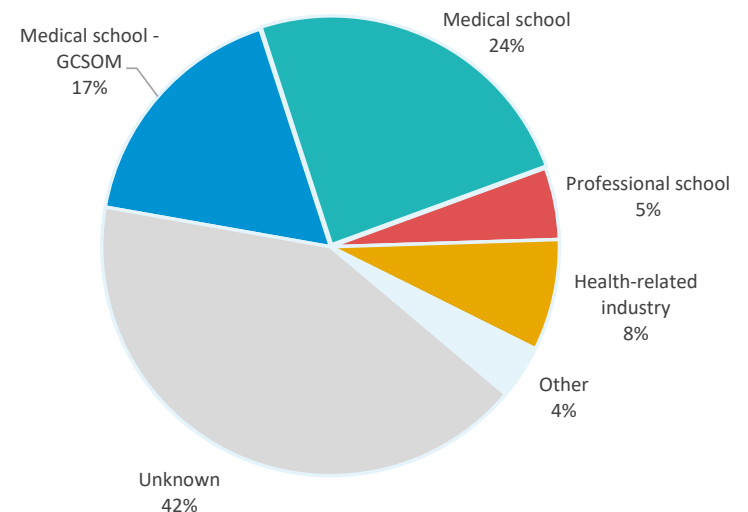
### MBS Alumni

MBS Alumni Outcomes



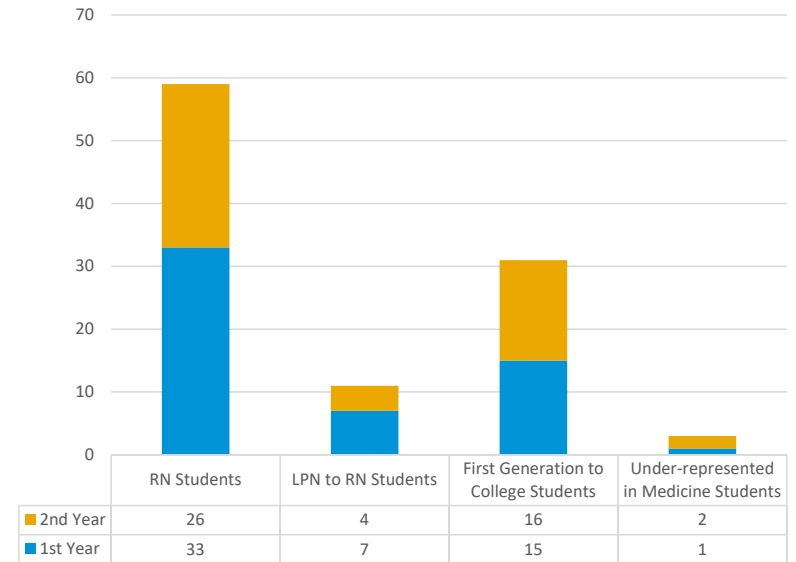
**Associate of Science in Nursing** *(also referred to as Associate Degree in Nursing or ADN)*

In 2022, Geisinger College of Health Sciences announced that it would establish Geisinger School of Nursing based in Lewistown. The new school offers an associate degree in nursing, providing the opportunity to become an RN in just two years. This program provides a solid steppingstone in the pursuit of a BSN for graduates who will be looking to advance their education. Geisinger School of Nursing graduates who decide to pursue a BSN after joining the Geisinger family may receive tuition remission.

The ADN has a contemporary competency and evidence-based curriculum, with both clinical and theoretical components. Current LPNs may enroll in our LPN to RN program and complete the degree over three semesters.

Total nursing school enrollment as of October 2023 is 70 which includes all RN and LPN to RN students in either their first or second year of the program.

**Geisinger’s Nursing Scholars Program**

Nine of our current nursing students are taking advantage of the Geisinger Nursing Scholars Program available to Geisinger employees to ease the financial burden of nursing school. The program awards \$40,000 in financial support with a 5-year work commitment as an inpatient registered nurse upon licensure.
