



From head to toe, better health is easier with a PCP

A primary care provider (PCP) is your child's first line of defense against illness. Through regular checkups, a PCP helps manage your child's health and catch potential health problems early, when they're easier to treat.

Why choose a PCP?

- They treat common medical conditions and provide preventive care.
- They keep your kids on track with health screenings.
- If your child has a chronic illness, they can help you manage it.
- Children who have a PCP generally have better health outcomes.

Besides your PCP, your child will have a care team of nurses and pharmacists devoted to keeping them healthy. And the MyChart app lets you manage your child's care online by sending messages, scheduling appointments and refilling medications.

To find a PCP near you, call the customer service number on your ID card or visit providers.geisinger.org. Choose one today and start your child on the path to better health!

Good health is rewarding





You can be rewarded just for keeping your child up to date on routine vaccines, dental visits and health screenings. It's easy — once your child completes these health activities, you'll earn a gift card. You don't need to do anything else.

• Immunizations for adolescents -

\$25 Walmart Healthy Living gift card. Members are eligible once they complete all adolescent vaccinations:

- One meningococcal vaccine between ages 11 and 13
- One Tdap vaccine between ages 10 and 13
- Two HPV vaccines between ages 9 and 13

Annual dental visit, age 2 to 18 -

\$25 Walmart Healthy Living gift card. Just complete one dental checkup with a licensed dental provider during the calendar year.

• Lead screening for infants and toddlers -

\$10 Walmart Healthy Living gift card. Members who are at least 9 months of age are eligible if they have at least one blood test to check for lead poisoning by their second birthday.

Lead screening

Children under 2 years old should be tested for lead exposure. Even low levels of lead in a child's blood can cause problems with learning and other behaviors. That's why the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has lowered the "lead reference value." It's the level showing a child has more lead in their blood than most U.S. children.

This is good news! It means kids can be identified as having too much lead in their blood sooner — so you can protect your child from lead exposure and the damage it can do.

Ingredients:

- 4 medium baking apples
 (e.g., Golden Delicious, Granny Smith, Honeycrisp)
- 1/2 cup oatmeal, quick cooking (uncooked)
- 1/4 cup brown sugar
- 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 1/3 cup 100% apple juice
- Nonstick cooking spray


Instructions:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350° F. Spray the bottom and sides of a 9-inch square baking dish with nonstick cooking spray.
- 2. Wash and peel the apples and cut them into thin slices. Spread the apple slices evenly over the bottom of the baking dish.
- 3. In a small bowl, use a fork to mix the oatmeal, brown sugar and cinnamon. Spread the oatmeal mix evenly over the apples. Pour the apple juice over the oatmeal mixture.
- 4. Cover and bake for 20 to 30 minutes until apples start to soften. Uncover and bake for another 15 to 20 minutes until apples are soft.

Don't lose your benefits!

To keep all your benefits from GHP Kids, you have to stay eligible for CHIP. Each year, you'll get a renewal packet in the mail from the Department of Human Services (DHS) when it's time to renew your CHIP coverage (at least 45 days before it's due). Complete and return the forms by mail or in person at your local county assistance office, or complete your renewal online on the COMPASS website, dhs.pa.gov/COMPASS. You can also renew by phone at 866-550-4355.

Be sure to submit your renewal, even if nothing has changed. Make sure your address and phone number are up to date. The Department of Human Services (DHS) will determine if you're still eligible. If you are, your coverage under GHP Kids will continue uninterrupted.
