## Get ready for flu season

Getting an annual flu shot is the best way to help prevent the flu. Need more reasons?

- You won't be as likely to spread the flu to friends, family and others.
- You'll lower your risk of complications (like pneumonia or sinus infections), as well as worsened chronic conditions (like diabetes or congestive heart failure).
- You won't have to take as many sick days from work or school.
- You'll be more likely to stay out of the doctor's office, so sicker patients can get the care they need.

## Lead testing for your child

If you have very young children, keep them healthy by getting them screened for lead poisoning. Serious health problems can occur when children are exposed over time to lead-based paint, lead pipes or lead-contaminated dust in older buildings.

When a child has high levels of lead in their body, they may have symptoms that include:

• Learning problems • Slow growth • Vomiting • Tiredness • Hearing loss • Constipation

Get your child tested at their 1-year well visit and then again at the 24-month well visit. Call your doctor or our CHIP member services at 866-621-5235 (PA Relay: 711) to schedule a professional screening.

## Your teen's first gynecologic visit

If you have a teenage daughter, she may have questions about the changes her body is going through. A gynecologist can answer those questions and make sure your daughter stays healthy as she grows older.

#### When should a teen see a gynecologist for the first time?

The American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists recommends girls have their first visit between age 13 and 15. Some things to consider are:

Early or late menstruation - In most cases the first menstrual period should begin 3 years after puberty starts, or between the ages of 12 and 13. If your daughter's first period doesn't fall in this age range, you may want to have her checked by a gynecologist for a hormone imbalance. It's also a good idea for her to be seen if periods are irregular for more than a year or two.

Very painful cramps or heavy periods – This can be a result of overactive hormones. If pain and cramps last more than a week or if more than 1 or 2 pads are soaked through per hour, visit a gynecologist to diagnose any issues.

**Sexual activity** - As soon as your daughter becomes sexually active, she should begin having regular sexually transmitted disease (STD) screenings and vaginal exams. It is also recommended that she receive the human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine before age 26.

### What can your teen expect at the first appointment?

Your teen's first appointment won't be like an adult's gynecologic exam. In fact, most gynecologists won't conduct a pelvic exam or Pap smear for teens who aren't sexually active. Usually the first few appointments are for creating open communication and trust, so the teen is comfortable speaking freely to their doctor if they have any concerns. During the appointment, the gynecologist will check your teen's vitals (like height, weight and blood pressure) and open the conversation for questions before conducting a quick external genital exam.

#### How often should your daughter see a gynecologist?

After the first visit, she may not need to be seen for a few years, especially if she isn't sexually active or doesn't have health issues like painful or irregular periods. The doctor can give you guidance on how often she needs to be seen.

Inpatient behavioral health services include services offered in a behavioral health hospital or residential facility. There are no day limits or copays.

Outpatient behavioral health services include services provided at a behavioral health facility and community-based services. There are no limits for behavioral health outpatient visits per benefit year, and no copays apply.

Inpatient substance use disorder services are delivered in a hospital or inpatient non-hospital facility that meets Department of Health requirements and is licensed as an alcohol/drug addiction treatment program. There are no day limits or copays.

Outpatient substance use disorder services are provided in a facility licensed by the Department of Health as an alcohol/drug treatment program.

There are no limits for substance use services visits per benefit year and no copays.


