### STEWARDSHIP FOREST RULES

You are making a voluntary decision to use these trails and do so at your own risk. There are potentially hazardous conditions both on and off-trail and you may encounter unexpectedly dangerous acts of man and/or nature. Anything could happen out there, so be prepared. **You are responsible for your own safety, so please follow the rules.**

These are multi-use trails (biking, hiking, running, etc.). In particular, only archery hunting is allowed on this property. Always yield to oncoming trail users. Dogs must be leashed at all times. **Respect other trail users** and be good ambassadors of your sport.

Some trails are designed to be traveled in a specific direction. Where necessary, one-way arrows are shown on this map. To maximize your trail use pleasure and to minimize unnecessary head-on collisions, please **follow all trail signage**.

For your own safety and so that we can keep these trails open, **stay on marked trails at all times**. Marked trails are your best bet to get home without a detour to the emergency room. Geisinger Stewardship Forest is surrounded by private property on every side. Please follow trail signage and respect private property.

**Be a good steward.** Leave no trace. When trails are excessively wet, walk, this avoids widening & erosion. Trail stewards are active trail users who have a sense of community and wish to volunteer in making the trails better for all users.
