Camps for special kids, including:

Reach Out and Read – Encourages childhood literacy through gifting new books to kids during annual check-up appointments.

Social Work Support Fund – Assists established patients who need assistance with transportation to attend Pediatric Specialty clinic appointments (Geisinger Medical Center).

Transport incubator – Stabilizes newborns with ventilator support and a controlled environment during transport (Geisinger Medical Center NICU).

Wispr Digital Otoscope – qty. 2 – Delivers unparalleled views of the eardrum in even small or partially obstructed ear canals, helping to make your ear exams (Geisinger Family Practice Milton).

Breathing measuring equipment — Accurately measures hydrogen, methane and carbon dioxide in exhaled breath (Geisinger Pediatrics Forty Fort).

Safe Sleep Swaddles Program — Promotes safe sleep and swaddling practices from the American Academy of Pediatrics.
