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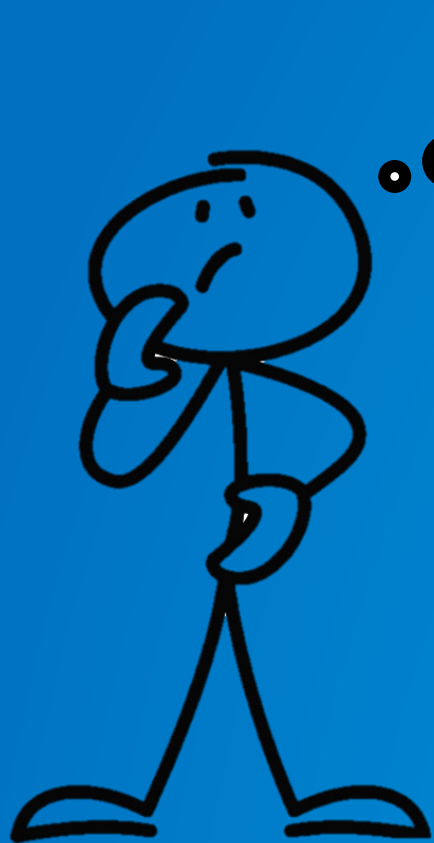

If you are a caregiver of a child or adult patient, you can use myGeisinger to **access information about their care** at your convenience, **communicate with their care team**, **manage prescriptions** and **more!**





How do I get access to my child's health records?

To request access to your child(ren)'s medical records, you must:

- Be the birth parent OR legal guardian of a child under 18 years old
- Have access to your own MyGeisinger account (if you don't have one, one will be created for you)
- Complete and return the appropriate parental authorization form

14-17

18 or older

Complete the "Under 14 Proxy Form" online via MyGeisinger or by print/mail.

Complete the "14-17 Proxy Form." Print, obtain child's signature and mail.

Complete the "Caregiver Form." Print, obtain adult child's signature and mail.

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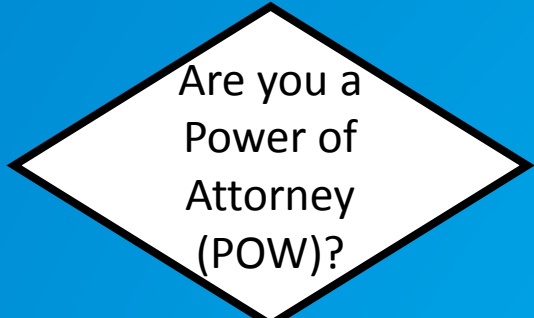
In order to not lose access to your child's records as they turn 14 or 18, be sure to submit the appropriate form prior to their birthday!



To request access to your adult loved one's medical records, you must:

- Obtain the patient's written approval (via form) OR provide Power of Attorney documentation
- Have access to your own MyGeisinger account (if you don't have one, one will be created for you)
- Complete and return the appropriate authorization form
