#### Integrity

#### **Excellence**

#### **Altruism**

The capacity to put the needs and interests of another before your own.

#### Respect

The regard for the autonomy and values of another person.

## **Empathy**

The ability to put oneself in another's situation, e.g., physician as patient.

#### Service

The sharing of one's talent, time and resources with those in need; giving beyond what is required.
