As we approach the holiday season and look forward to a new year, I am pleased to update you on some important developments at The Commonwealth Medical College (TCMC).

It was a great day in northeast Pennsylvania as we celebrated another milestone in the history of TCMC with the Dedication of the Medical Sciences Building. This significant landmark in downtown Scranton is home to TCMC's academic and research programs.

During the Dedication ceremony, I was reminded of the talents and contributions of the founders who embraced the vision of creating the region's only medical school. I gratefully acknowledge those individuals who provided the assistance to build the foundation of our academic programs. It is because of their foresight that we currently have 194 medical students, 137 from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and 57 from our 16 counties. HRSA Grant Supports Curriculum

Valerie Weber, MD, MS, FACP, Chair, Department of Clinical Sciences was awarded a primary care pre-doctoral training grant from the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA). The award, totaling



\$875,000 over five years, provides funding for the implementation and evaluation of TCMC's innovative curriculum. This provides each medical student with a continuity mentor relationship with a primary care physician, from northeast and north central PA, over the course of their four years at TCMC. This program aims to increase the number of TCMC students who will choose careers in family medicine, general internal medicine or pediatrics, an important regional and national need. The project aims to ensure that all TCMC graduates, whatever their specialty choice, will possess the skills to allow them to function well as members of interdisciplinary teams and the medical home model. Dr. Valerie Weber is Principal Investigator on the grant.

In July 2011, the results of the United States Medical Licensing Examination (USMLE) were announced and the class of 2013 scored extremely well. 98% of TCMC third year students have passed Step I of the USMLE. This is an extraordinary accomplishment last year 92% of all US/Canadian first-time test takers passed the exam. This is testament to TCMC's academic program, quality of students, faculty and staff and learning environment.

Step I of the USMLE determines whether medical students can apply important concepts of the basic sciences to the practice of medicine and can demonstrate a foundation for the safe and competent practice of medicine.





Third Year Clinical Experiences in the Community

TCMC's class of 2013 reunited in Scranton on October 24, 2011, for Core Week, an intensive week-long program to review skills and evaluate learning experiences in their regional campuses in northeast and north central Pennsylvania. Here is what third-year medical students had to say about TCMC's Longitudinal Integrated Clerkship (LIC), an innovative curriculum that builds upon early clinical experiences in years one and two.

Jeremy Celestine Hometown: Greensburg, PA

From the start of his medical education, Jeremy Celestine shadowed family medicine practitioner Joseph Anistranski, MD, in his office in Wilkes-Barre. There,



he learned how to interact with patients and build relationships while learning the basics of performing patient histories and physicals. While Dr. Anistranski still remains a major contributor to his medical education training, Jeremy now sees patients by connecting with preceptors in the core medical disciplines. "Third year is exciting - you never know what you're going to see each day," Jeremy stated. "More importantly, I have the opportunity to see the whole patient, their health and the social determinants that may cause or effect the treatment of disease," stated Jeremy. So far, the highlight of his clinical experience was delivering a baby during his inpatient "burst" with his preceptor. "These hands-on clinical experiences provide the skills needed to become a compassionate and caring physician," he continued.

Jessica Warnke Hometown: Chesterfield, VA

Working with six Williamsportbased preceptors has been a team experience for Jessica Warnke. "We're trying to figure out what works best for me and my preceptor as a



team so that I get the best experience possible," Jessica said. That experience is different for each of her classmates and Jessica enjoys building a schedule and process that works for her. That means getting extra experience even on the weekend. When Jessica's hematology/oncology preceptor, Warren Robinson, MD, contacted her on a Saturday morning regarding an interesting patient case she could learn from, she was happy to see and follow the patient in the hospital. "I'm learning how to follow patients in the hospital, and it provides great experience," she said.

Hassan Ahmad Hometown: Lower Gwynedd, PA

For Hassan Ahmad, learning in the LIC model has resulted in more freedom to explore his clinical interests and develop strong bonds with his preceptors. "In other medical



schools, students see their preceptor for only four to six weeks. At TCMC, I see my preceptor week after week the entire year and we've been able to build a true mentoring relationship because our interactions are spread out," said Hassan. This model allows Hassan more freedom to pursue his clinical and research interests using white space built into his schedule. He's used the time to explore interventional radiology, work individually with Scranton-based endovascular surgeon, Alessandro Smeraldi, MD, and to conduct research. "In addition to my clinical study, I just started a research project studying local breast cancer patients and the use of MRI. Combining clinical experience and research experience is really allowing me to realize my interests," Hassan stated.

Longitudinal Integrated Clerkship (LIC)

- Provides third-year medical students with a year-long experience within each of the six core disciplines of medicine, surgery, pediatrics, psychiatry, OB/GYN and family medicine at the same time by connecting with clinical preceptors and patient panels
- Allows for students to spend their days much as a physician in office practice does seeing patients who are followed longitudinally through their medical care in ambulatory settings and inpatient or hospital setting when they are admitted
- e Engages more than 800 volunteer faculty members in ambulatory settings including physician offices and inpatient settings such as affiliate hospitals and healthcare facilities throughout TCMC's 16 county region
- Involves various learning opportunities including group and case-based learning sessions and tutorials, inpatient rounds, ER experiences, didactic sessions between regional campuses and self-directed learning
- Serves as an innovative alternative to clinical block rotations that no longer expose medical students to the spectrum of illness needed to learn the full course of disease

TCMC Receives Grant from NEPA Alliance

TCMC received an Appalachia Regional Commission (ARC) grant from the NEPA Alliance in the amount of \$150,000 to train students to be technicians or technical specialists in biomedical research. The Professional Science of Masters program is a 21-month program that prepares a workforce for a career path as research scientists for companies in biotech, life sciences and pharmaceutical companies, as well as academic research labs. The grant will help the development of research and a potential biotech industry in northeast Pennsylvania by creating a trained, available workforce prepared for jobs in a growing industry. Office of Sponsored Programs Secures \$10 Million

Research News

Raj Kumar, PhD, Professor of Biochemistry, co-authored a study to discover a new defense against a common hospital-acquired infection prevalent in elderly patients. Clostridium difficile (CDI) is a bacterial



infection that can cause diarrhea as well as more serious intestinal conditions such as colitis (inflammation of the colon); in the most severe cases CDI can be fatal. Dr. Kumar's research will point the way to a promising new approach for treating an intestinal disease that has become more common, more severe, and harder to cure in recent years. The findings, in conjunction with researchers at the University of Texas Medical Branch at Galveston, were published online in the August edition of the journal *Nature Medicine*. The researchers are preparing to launch clinical trials using their discovery as a new CDI therapeutic approach.

Hani Atamna, PhD, Assistant Professor of Neuroscience, was awarded a grant from the NIH National Institute of Aging, to lead a novel neurodegenerative research effort that can lead to



a treatment to slow down the aging process. The award, totaling \$313,000 over three years, provides funding to investigate how methlyene blue, a one hundred-year-old-drug, effects cell repair and strength during the aging process.

This study may lead to a regional clinical trial to treat and slow down the effects of dementia. Hani Atamna is Principal Investigator on the grant.

Darina Lazarova, PhD, Assistant Professor of Molecular Biology,

is the lead principal investigator on the research report "A switch from canonical to noncanonical Wnt signaling mediates drug resistance in colon cancer cells,"



which was recently published in *PLoS ONE*. Dr. Lazarova's research findings indicate that a diet regimen that provides both fiber and a compound contained in honey bee propolis may protect against colon cancer. Her results are congruent with the recent announcement of The World Cancer Research Fund/American Institute for Cancer Research's Continuous Update Project that the protective role of dietary fiber against colorectal cancer is "convincing." Co-authors on this research project were Michael Bordonaro, PhD, TCMC Assistant Professor of Molecular Biology, Shruti Tewari, Catherine E. Cicco, and Wafa Atamna. This project and other research on colon cancer at TCMC has been funded by three grants awarded to Drs. Michael Bordonaro and Darina Lazarova, totaling \$740,147 from the NIH National Cancer Institute and the American Institute for Cancer Research.

Results of Vitamin D Research Presented at National Conference

Thomas Churilla, a third-year medical student, served as lead author in a clinical research study conducted at Northeast Radiation Oncology Center (NROC), Dunmore. The study revealed widespread vitamin D deficiency in cancer patients and an association with more advanced stages of cancer. The results were shared at the national meeting of ASTRO (American Society for Radiation Oncology) in Miami, Florida in October 2011.

The study was directed by TCMC clinical faculty member, Christopher A. Peters, MD, radiation

oncologist and coordinator of clinical research at NROC. Other members of the study team included radiation oncologist Harmar D. Brereton, MD, and Mary Klem, MS, RD, CSO, LDN.
